Guru Hargobind Sahib was born at village Guru Ki Wadali (district Amritsar) on 5th July 1596. He succeeded Guru Arjan Sahib in 1606, at the age of eleven years. Following the martyrdom of Guru Arjan Sahib, a change had taken place in the character of Sikh Nation.

There was a need to adopt both spiritual and political ways simultaneously, a character Guru Hargobind Sahib ji demonstrated by wearing two swords, one of Spiritual Power - Piri and the other of Military Power - Miri. Now the Sikhs became "Saint-Soldier."

Guru Har Krishan ji, the second son of Guru Har Rai Sahib and Mata Krishan Kaur ji, was born on 7th July 1656. He was of an age of 5 when he attained Guruship and hence the leadership of the Sikh people. In Delhi during a smallpox epidemic he served the sick without the thought of danger to himself. Even at such a young age Guru Har Krishan ji had a rare ability in explaining passages from the Holy Granth Sahib.

Gurdwara Bangla Sahib stands today at the site of Raja Jai Singh's bungalow, the residence in Delhi of Guru Har Kishan ji.
