Guru Ram Das ji Gurgaddi 11 Sept; Joti Jot – 1 September

Bani's by Guru Guru Ram Das ji, in addition to 688 hymns, which include Rehras and Kirtan sohela are recited daily. Another contribution by Guru ji is The Lavan recited and sung during the ceremony of Anand Karaj, a Sikh marriage.

Guru ji was planner and creator of the township of Ramdaspur which became the Sikh holy city of Amritsar. He founded it in 1574 on land he bought for 700 rupees from the owners of the village of Tung. In Amritsar, he designed the gurdwara Harmandir Sahib, which translates as "The Abode of God" also known as the Darbaar Sahib.

Guru Arjan Dev ji - Gurgaddi 19 September

The fifth Guru, Shri Guru Arjan Dev Ji, was bestowed upon with the "Divine Light" by Guru Ramdas Ji in 1581. Guru Arjan Dev Ji was bom at Goindwal Sahib on the 15th April 1563. Guru ji was a saint and scholar of the highest quality and repute. He learnt Gurmukhi Script, Gurbani, Persian, Hindi and Sanskrit languages from Baba Budha Ji. Guru Ji was sweet, humble and a perfect blend

Guru Amar Das Ji Joti Jot day –14 September

The following firsts are attributed to Guru Amar Das ji:

All visitors to Gurdwaras were to first take Langar (Free Blessed Food) together before seeing the Guru.

Further abolished the Caste System.

Lifted the status of women and gave them equality with men.

Prohibited the practice of Sati (the dying of the wife on her husband's funeral pyre) "Parrda" (veil to cover the face),

Established an Administration system for management of the increasing size of the Sikh congregations, called Manjis

Gift of the prayer called Anand Sahib,

Established the city of Goindval on the banks of river Bias in 1552

Guru Nanak Dev ji Joti Jot day – 24 September

Guru Nanak is the founder of the religion of Sikhism and the first of the ten Sikh Gurus. Traveling far and wide, Guru Nanak taught people the message of one God who dwells in every one of His creations and constitutes the eternal Truth. He preached the new idea of God as Supreme, Universal, All-powerful and truthful, Formless (Nirankar), Fearless (Nirvair), the Sole, the Creator, the self- existent, the Incomprehensible and the Ever-lasting creator of all things (Karta Purakh). He stated that God is infinite, All knowing, All-giver, Without hate (nirvair), Omnipotent, and Satnam, the Eternal and Absolute Truth.
